2 Corinthians 8:9 – For you know the generous grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich.

Grace, Mercy, and Peace to you in the name of Christ Jesus!

As we continue our Lenten Journey and approach Holy Week, I was reminded of St. Paul's 2nd letter to the Corinthians, when he describes what Martin Luther referred to as the "Happy Exchange". This is the way Martin Luther understood Christ's death on the cross- that by being executed as a criminal, Jesus took on our sin, which Paul describes using the metaphor of "poverty." This is the broken part of our lives which prevents us from living with abundant grace- with faith, hope, and love. Paul uses the image of poverty as an opportunity to demonstrate Jesus' generosity. Jesus of course was not wealthy in a worldly sense- on the contrary, he was an itinerant preacher, teacher, and healer who told his disciples not to carry extra money around with them but to depend on others' generosity! Jesus' "wealth" was in his trust that God was making creation new through and around him. By becoming "poor", Paul describes how Jesus withheld nothing of himself in his trust of God's power of life- not even his own life, which he gave up to the world on the cross. But in giving up his body to the "poverty" of sin- to the hopelessness of the cross, Jesus demonstrated that even his own death would ultimately serve the power of God's life. And on Easter morning, the richness of God's grace was revealed in Jesus' resurrection and the new resurrection life that he shared with his disciples, and through them, with the whole world.

We are witnessing in this moment the ravages of sin in the violence of the Russian invasion and destruction of Ukraine. Many of us may feel helpless, myself included, when we hear about what is happening on the other side of the world between nations that many of us know little about. Yet when we witness the bombings, when we see the pictures of the victims or those who have recently become refugees, when we hear the stories of those who are trying to protect their homes and keep their loved ones safe, our hearts are broken. When we open our eyes to the suffering of our neighbors, suddenly the power of God in Christ Jesus takes on a new urgency and reality in our world. This is Christ's body, being broken in front of our eyes by the power of sin in the form of warfare: bullets, artillery strikes, rocket attacks, and fighter jets. The fact that many of the targets of these attacks are civilian structures and organizations only underlines the image of the cross. So, what is our response to

witnessing this spectacle of death? Perhaps it is cynicism and despair- I'm sure we all feel these things. But also, perhaps, we will be moved to compassion and action on account of our brothers and sisters in Ukraine, and anywhere there is needless violence and suffering. Perhaps we will witness the power of resurrection life through the unity of a world that condemns this war and stands up to defend the powerless. Let us remember on our Lenten journey how Jesus is being made known to us in this moment- and how through his suffering, he has made us all rich in grace.

With the recent announcement of 100,000 Ukrainian refugees coming to the United States, LIRS needs our help now more than ever. Monetary donations are currently being collected to help provide essential support for newly arrived families, including medical care, temporary housing, financial support for basic necessities, and more. <u>Death Sentence</u>

Imagine that you are on trial in the court of law for a crime that you committed. The deliberations have concluded and closing arguments have been completed by the lawyers for the prosecution and the defense. Your heart is racing, your palms are sweaty and the anxiety you are feeling is beyond description. The sentence for the sin you've been convicted of carries the possibility of a life sentence or the death penalty. The judge enters the courtroom from his chambers; everyone rises. He explains that you have been found guilty of the crime and are being sentenced to death. As you hear the words, it feels as though the blood drains from your body, your legs begin to shake, and you are dizzy and feel faint. Just as your lawyer reaches over to help you stand, you hear a voice saying. "I'll serve the sentence; take me".

Because of our sinful nature, we too were sentenced to death over. But then Jesus said, "Take me", when he died on the cross for our sins granting us forgiveness, freedom from our sins and eternal life. This is a gift; the only thing that is required is to believe it, receive it, and accept it. The reality is that we could never do enough good to deserve this gift. Is anyone of us without sin? I don't think so. Paul said it best:

"For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do – this I keep on doing." Romans 7:19

Jesus' death on the cross abolished the notion that we need to do good works to obtain eternal life. In addition, it impossible for us to do this because we continue to sin in various degrees no matter how hard we try not to.

"For it is by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

Ephesians 2:8

I'm not advocating that we shouldn't do good works. As you read in the verse above, God's word calls us and encourages us to do good works. The important distinction is the reason behind the good works. Our motivation in doing them is because God and Jesus first loved us: the love and grace that we have been shown dwells in our hearts. Its effect empowers us to love others through good works. Our hearts are moved to love and do good works because of the great gift that God has given us through Jesus' death and resurrection. As believers, our place in heaven is secure. The good works we do are a result of our hearts being transformed by the sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross for our sins that grants eternal life.

As you continue the last half of your Lenten journey, may you know with conviction that eternal life is yours through Christ's death and resurrection on the cross. And may you also embrace that because of this great gift, your heart will be moved to love others and show that love through good works.


