Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Advent is, like Lent, a season of preparation. We prepare for Christ's "Coming" (the meaning of Advent in Latin) in remembering his birth in Bethlehem, and his promise of coming again at the end of all things. In both senses, we are anticipating a radical change in our lives and in the world by God's incarnate presence among us. Therefore, we use the term "Emanuel" at this time of the year especially, which in Hebrew means "God with us." There are many important parts of the nativity story that we'll remember together: how Mary and Joseph were homeless as they sought a place to rest and prepare for the birth of Jesus. How the first to learn about the birth of the Messiah were not kings or governors, but lowly shepherds in the hills. How when the Magi visited Jesus from far away, they brought him not only kingly gifts of gold and frankincense incense, but also myrrh, an aromatic resin made into incense or oil that was used in the process of preparing the dead for burial in the ancient world. Even at his birth, his crucifixion is foreshadowed by this gift. For as we anticipate his birth and dwelling among us, we also remember his death and the promise of the resurrection.

One way that we'll be remembering this story and anticipating Christ's coming is through music. Both through the music we will sing together during Sunday worship, as well as a special event coming up in just a few weeks on **December 2nd at 6:30pm, Winter Wonderland, a Christmas Recital**. Our musical director, Gregg LeMay, has organized a recital to help us to get into the spirit of Advent and come together to enjoy some of the many wonderful musical pieces that we associate with this time of year. Gregg will be playing both sacred music as well as some secular Christmas music that everyone will recognize. The recital will also feature some shared pieces with other musicians, and our churches' joint choir will be singing an anthem at the recital. I've been singing along with this choir for the past few weeks, and it's so nice to be part of a choir again- I missed it a lot! Hebron's sanctuary will also feature special decorations to help us to be fully immersed in the season. After the concert, we'll be gathering in Hebron's social hall for fellowship and refreshments. To connect this recital with Christ's mission in the world, we'll be gathering items for the **Five Forces Homeless Heroes Stocking Project**, which is collecting personal care items for homeless veterans around western Pennsylvania. Monetary donations will also be accepted. We're hoping that this recital tradition will continue each year rotating between our two churches. Please spread the word about this exciting opportunity to come together and listen to the beautiful music of Advent and Christmas.

But as always, the best way to prepare our hearts for Christ's coming is to join us in worship on Sunday mornings throughout Advent, as we light the candles on the wreath and remember the longing of the people of God for Christ to show us the way of peace. We will have our usual "Blue Christmas" Service at St Paul's Highfield on the winter solstice, Wednesday, December 21st at 6pm for anyone who is missing their loved ones at this time of the year. And we will of course have our Candlelight Christmas Eve services this year- 6pm at Hebron and 8pm at St Paul's Highfield. Since it lands on a Sunday this year, we'll just have one worship service on Christmas morning, at Hebron, at 8:30am.

Is Thanksgiving Really Over?

The leftovers have been eaten and the refrigerator is almost back to its pre- Thanksgiving appearance. The extra chairs and the tables are put back into proper storage. And the wonderful gatherings of love, fellowship and thanksgiving have been replaced by cherished memories. But is Thanksgiving *really* over?

In Thessalonians 5:18 we are encouraged to "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus". Really? In *all* situations? That's a tough one. How can we be thankful in our human condition as we experience brokenness, loss, grief, physical pain, financial challenges, relationship struggles and the host of other burdens that afflict us?

Insight into this difficult question lies in the coming of Advent, which we have just entered. This is the time of preparation for the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Because he was born, lived as man and God, and died on the cross for our sins, we have been given the greatest gift ever, eternal life.

It's fitting that Thanksgiving Day precedes Advent, as our hearts are already filled with gratitude from all the blessings that God has bestowed on us. This prepares our hearts to celebrate Jesus' birth more fully; to love and to give to others more freely because of the great gift that we've been given. As we know that his birth comes first, then his life, then his death on the cross for our sins. If Jesus had not been born, we would be subject to sin and there would be no inheritance of eternal life.

So maybe now, we can answer the difficult question asked in the above paragraph. Can we really, "Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus"?" the answer is a resounding "YES". This is because, as believers, we know that we have been blessed with our lives here, and all the God has given us. But we also know and embrace that this life is finite and at some later time, God will call us to our eternal home. So, we know that whatever difficulties we endure here will not last but will dissolve with our lives here and will not follow us into eternal life. In the end, it will all be good; correction, not good - GREAT.

GRAM'S MOLASSES COOKIES:

½ cup brown sugar

1 egg

2 ½ cups sifted flour

½ tsp. cinnamon

½ cup shortening

½ cup molasses

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. baking soda mixed in ¼ cup hot water

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- 2. Cream together brown sugar and shortening
- 3. Add egg and molasses
- 4. Add flour, salt, cinnamon and baking soda mixture
- 5. Beat until all ingredients are combined
- 6. Drop by teaspoon onto a cookie sheet
- 7. Bake for approximately 12 minutes


