⁷Again, I saw vanity under the sun: ⁸the case of solitary individuals, without sons or brothers; yet there is no end to all their toil, and their eyes are never satisfied with riches. "For whom am I toiling," they ask, "and depriving myself of pleasure?" This also is vanity and an unhappy business. ⁹Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. ¹⁰For if they fall, one will lift up the other; but woe to one who is alone and falls and does not have another to help. ¹¹Again, if two lie together, they keep warm; but how can one keep warm alone? ¹²And though one might prevail against another, two will withstand one. A threefold cord is not quickly broken.

Dear Friends,

Keeping a congregation running is hard work, and I'm not talking about my job. All of you do keep me busy, but no pastor can keep a congregation on its feet. It's the volunteers who sing in the choir, lead bible study, or show up to fix a doorknob that someone had trouble with last Sunday that are the backbone of any congregation. It's the tap on my shoulder or the hand raised in council followed by the phrase "Pastor, I was thinking maybe we could..." that keeps us moving forward.

I get giddy when I hear that phrase, because I know we're about to hear some Holy Spirit Stuff. Sometimes it's a cleaning of the basement that really has been put off far too long, and we do need to make it more welcoming for when guests arrive. Other times we're about to get all hands-on deck for some absolute craziness that we probably shouldn't attempt. When the dust settles, we will find ourselves exhausted and knowing only one thing. God was involved.

Every time the work will be hard. Volunteers will arrive to spend hours of their day that needed to be carved from some other priority. Sometimes it will be easy to ask why we are doing it. Divided into our individual congregational bubbles, we will look around at the same crew that always shows up and wonder "for whom are we toiling." Sometimes that is a legitimate question. If we are toiling only to serve ourselves, we should probably rethink it. Sometimes it is because of how solitary we are in our congregational lives, each little community trying to do things alone.

The wisdom of Ecclesiastes, written above, tells us that two are better than one, and that a threefold cord is not quickly broken. As individuals we need the congregation to help us strengthen our spiritual resolve. Our congregations need the larger church for the same reason.

On July 16th we have an opportunity to gather together in worship as, at least, a sevenfold cord (that has to be a hard one to break). We will gather at 10:00 am at the Constitution Pavilion in Crooked Creek for a joint worship with many of our ELCA churches. There will be a joint choir with rehearsal on July 15 at 10:00 am at Grace in Manorville. We'll have fun. It's become one of my favorite parts of the summer.

A joint service won't make the work easy. It won't even get it done, but the Holy Spirit will show up. You may find yourself inspired to whisper those beautiful little words to you congregation's leadership, "I've been thinking maybe we could" Maybe that basement will finally get cleaned. It does need it. (So does my office, but that's probably one I should deal with on my own) Maybe, if we're lucky, some absolute craziness will ensue and we'll end up on a ride that arrives at the church of the future. No matter what, we'll sing songs, read scriptures, and pray for church, world, and all those in need. Oh, and we'll have a fun picnic too. Hope to see you there.

Johns; Motion made and carried to keep the endowment in the ELCA Federal Credit Union; A portion of the endowment has been designated to the campership fund; Finance Committee has a meeting scheduled with Prudential to discuss current endowments
- All paperwork for the 2020, 2021 & 2022 audit is prepared and ready for the Audit Team

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

• Lucas will be confirmed on June 25; Lay Leader Jennifer Schaefer will begin service and Pastor Jim will assist with the Affirmation of Baptism; Pastor Jim has also volunteered to distribute Holy Communion; A reception will be held in the Social Hall immediately after service; Barb, Marty, Velma volunteered to make food; Carolyn and Chelsae will bring pastries; Planning for around 40-45 people

PROPERTY:

- Planning to hold the Church Work Day in the fall, maybe end of August/beginning of September; Barb would like to update different parts of the parsonage and church property to help make landscaping easier; Motion made and carried for these property updates; Barb and Velma will be donating all materials needed
- Lawn care has been great with volunteers; Will continue this throughout summer


