Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

I thought I would take some time this month to talk about an essential part of our life of faith: stewardship. Stewardship is probably an unfamiliar word to many folks outside of the church context. I remember an old friend of mine worked for the "Land Stewardship Project" up in Minnesota, which is an organization that promotes sustainable agriculture and a healthy relationship with the land that supports our livelihood. I think this is a useful way to think about the concept of stewardship- taking care of the land and the world which God has created to sustain us and all creatures. Genesis 1 tells the creation story wherein God commands human beings to have dominion over the earth- and what this really means in Hebrew is not to dominate, but to care for and protect the whole earth.

The stewardship of our church is connected to and an extension of our stewardship for God's creation. We are called, as baptized and confirmed members of the Body of Christ, to serve, care for, and protect God's church- both the church as a whole (the catholic or universal church), and the local churches that we call "ours". There are many ways that we can serve our churches. An important way is to share our resources with the church- our time, our money, and our energy. Some of us have more of one kind of these resources than others, and that's ok. Some folks would rather give money to support the church, and others would rather give time and energy. The church needs both kinds of people. We are all called to share with the church- and it is discerning our vocation, our calling, to determine how and what is the best way to share our gifts with God's church.

Tithing or giving 10% is an ancient tradition. It was the earliest form of taxation, though of course in our day and age it has become voluntary instead of compulsory. Sometimes in the bible this was called the "first fruits"- when people of God would share the first part of their harvest- and this could be literally fruit, grain, or animals- with the temple and the community. There is nothing magical about 10%- it was simply a rule of thumb in the ancient world as a way of designating a portion of one's wealth be shared for the greater good. Nowadays, some folks can only afford 5%, and some folks can give more than 10%. You're not a better person if you give more- but, at the same time, it might feel good and freeing to do so. Giving doesn't make us better or holier people- but it can help us experience God's generosity in a real and tangible way, and this is the *real point* of stewardship: recognizing that so much of life and this world is not in our control, and yet God shares abundant life with us. We don't deserve or earn it, but still, God gives to us out of unconditional love. God wants each of us to experience that kind of grace and desire to give in our daily lives- the desire to share what we have to support others- not only our own children or loved ones, but with your neighbor, church, and community. God wants us to *actually feel generosity in our hearts* not just give because it's a social expectation- for fear and generosity are diametrically opposed. To give generously is to overcome the fear of "not enough".

So much of our lives feel the pinch and threat of scarcity- but this is, according to the good news- a delusion that the world and the devil have cast over our eyes so that we can't see the abundance of God's creation and the possibility of sharing all that God has shared with us. It's not easy by any means to make financial decisions in our world, but when we are inspired by the Spirit, we can make decisions that free us from delusion and help us to see that no matter what, everything belongs to God, and we don't need to cling so tightly to our own sense of "I, me, and mine". This is the way that Jesus demonstrates to us in giving his life out of love for the sake of the world God loves. Amen.

MARINATED VEGETABLES:

1 can kitchen-cut green beans, drained 1 can LeSueur early peas, drained 1 can white shoe peg corn, drained 1 tbsp. chopped pimento, for color 1 cup chopped celery 1 cup chopped onion 1/4 cup green pepper

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Then prepare marinade.

MARINADE:

1 tbsp. water
½ cup oil
1 cup sugar
¾ cup cider vinegar
½ tsp. pepper



Blend marinade ingredients in a blender. Pour over vegetables and mix gently. Refrigerate covered for 24 hours. Stir gently before serving. Will keep for 2 weeks covered in refrigerator.


