Dear Friends in Christ,

At the beginning of this year, a dear friend of mine gave me a precious gift; it was a bible which was laid out in daily readings so that by the end of the year, one will have read most texts from the entire bible. Currently, I'm making my way through the Book of Acts. Another resource I enjoy is a daily bible app on my phone, which also includes an alert that I receive twice a day to remind me to read it (which I definitely need)! Yesterday's bible verse from the book of Acts spoke loudly to me. It caused me to reflect on Paul's life and all that he experienced as he preached and witnessed throughout the world after his conversion on the road to Damascus.

"And now, behold, I go bound in the spirit unto Jerusalem, not knowing the things that shall befall me there...." Acts 20:22

This verse is a statement which was a part of Paul's message to the elders of the church in Ephesus during his ministry. The verse continues with:

"except that the Holy Spirit testifies in every city. Saying that chains and tribulations await me. But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God."

Acts 22:24

While we do not face the same destiny that awaited Paul: persecution, punishment, or possible death, we too live lives of great uncertainty. We awake each morning by the grace of God, not knowing "the things that shall befall us" that day. We hear news of loss of life by weather calamities, shootings and terrorist attacks. We know of individuals who received a diagnosis of a terminal illness that changed their life immediately. We lose loved ones, endure relationship difficulties and worry about our children and other loved ones. But we, like Paul, must rely on the Holy Spirit to guide us each day to navigate the uncertainties and difficulties of life in this fallen world. We too, must rely on the grace of God which will hold us up and sustain us during these uncertain times as we too, continue to run the race set before us and finish strong.


